Tell something about graphic designing

Movie posters, concert tickets, corporate reports, your favourite apps and of course this website ... all rely on effective design to get the user's attention and get to the heart of what the client is trying to say. Good communication skills are an essential part of the designer's toolkit. Making designs that look great on the page is nice, but one of the most important parts of the graphic design process happens even before you put pen to paper—listening to and interpreting what the client needs. What is the underlying problem they're trying to solve? Once this has been established the designer can work with the client to find the best way to visually communicate their message to the target audience and impact them in a positive way.

What are the difficulties you faced when you started designing ?

Working as a Graphic Designer is not as glorified as many make it out to be. Sure we sit behind our fancy computer setups, sketching 'pretty pictures' in our Moleskin notebooks and can do business from the comforts of our own homes, but it can also be one of the most stressful, involving and cutting edge jobs out there.

The main challenges I faced initially was to learn the softwares, have my work critiqued and displayed on a 'pedestal', manage tight and strict deadlines, consistently stay creative...and when I have time, live my daily life. Designers play many roles, wear different hats and face many challenges daily. There are many days when I throw my hands up in the air out of exhaustion and frustration, but in the end there is nothing I rather do with my life and career.

Describe yourself as a graphic designer?

My passion for design is much more than sitting in front of my lappy and making ugly things look beautiful, it is to inspire and broaden minds with my work. As I mentioned earlier, I am very much precise and focused and a perfectionist when it comes to my work.

Describe your daily routine

Well I start off my day with my alarm ringing. I eventually get up after few "5 minutes more"s. Then I have my morning cup of tea and some knick knacks to go with it.
